Fall Equinox and Summer Solstice Bring the Elephants

OCAL ARTIST ENGAGEMENT WAS HIGH as the Summer Solstice crew celebrated two back to back events: Fall Equinox and Elephant Appreciation day at Legacy Arts Santa Barbara. During the festivities, an call was opened, good until November 15th, for artists of all stripes to submit their designs for life-size baby elephant sculptures that will accompany the 2025 Elephant Day Parade.

The Elephant Parade is an exhibit of painted statues that decorate a city briefly, and then are auctioned off to raise awareness and money towards elephant preservation and conservation. Groovy Gary, one of the Elephant Parade's statuesque ambassadors, was sent out to inspire Santa Barbaran's to submit their

designs, with the goal of putting Santa Barbara on the map for 2025.

In support of this campaign, City Council Member Oscar Gutierrez, Legacy Arts founders Crispin Barrymore

and Laela Duncan, and artists of all ages participated. Towards this goal, Barrymore pledged \$2500 for a "blank" Elephant to be painted by a local artist, to be announced.

Christopher Noxon

In the professional category, the winning entry is Christopher Noxon's "Phantasmagorical Elephant".

Christopher's illustrations have been featured in The New York Times, The Hollywood Reporter, The Undo List, Modern Loss. At some point in his past, Christopher worked as a costumed character at Universal Studios, which may be another indicator of why he answered the "call" for artists from Solstice -- in addition to his desire to portray "the playful and the unexpected."

He also spent 30 years as a noted journalist for national magazines and newspapers, contributing to The New Yorker, Details, The New York Times Magazine, Los Angeles Magazine, and Salon besides his books and a whole lot more.

Elena Pablo

Twelve year old Elena Pablo, a student at Washington Elementary School, is the winner in the youth category for her design. Elena says "It makes me feel proud of my art, and encourages me. "I want to become an art teacher." She completed her drawing with colored pencils at Plaza Palooza, the opening of the Michael Towbes Plaza at the Santa Barbara Library. Winner Christopher Noxon, agreed to paint the blank elephant, submitted his maquette (miniature pictured to the left) of his design.

"Phantasmagorical Landscapelephant" by Christopher Noxon was approved as part of the international Elephant "herd."





Another fun turn of events: Elephant Parade®provided a blank Elephant to provide an activation for Earth Da y2025! Hundreds of kids chalked the life-sized blank elephant and created their designs on the Elephant Parade® coloring page.



After Earth day, the blank elephant was cleaned, prepped, painted white, then a base coat of pink was applied to prepare the lifesized baby elephant sculpture to be painted by Christopher for the Parade.

There was a Paint the Pachyderm Party at the Workshop with Solstice artists assisting Christopher Noxon in applying his design to the elephant. He first sketched out his design, making some slight adjustments. Following his direction, Solstice artists, Board Members and volunteers did the initial filling in of colors Then Christopher spent the next couple weeks fine tuning and finishing his design.



A platform was built and the Phantasmagorial landscapephant had its premier performance in the 2025 Solstice Parade, and was on display in the Summer Solstice Festival in Alameda Park Saturday and Sunday June 21-22.



The Elephant was then in the Ojai Fourth of July Parade and is now on display in the courtyard of the Ojai Valley Museum, until the next event!
